

A Bill to Increase Antibiotic Development (ADAPT)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 There will be accelerated pathways for antibiotics and antifungals, an **SECTION 1**. 2 increase in antibiotic and antimicrobial resistance monitoring by the 3 Center for Disease Control (CDC), and the establishment of a streamlined 4 antibiotic labeling and confirmation process by the FDA to ensure the 5 most updated and recent data is always available to health-care 6 professionals. 7 **SECTION 2.** The new pathways for antibiotics come in the form of an easier FDA 8 9 approval system for treating emerging threats in limited patient populations. The CDC's increased monitoring on antibiotic resistance 10 growth, both fungal and bacteria resistance shall be made available to 11 the public and, more specifically, health-care professionals. 12 **SECTION 3.** The Federal Drug Administration will be in charge of implementing all 13 changes this law creates and will work with the Center for Disease 14 15 Control to form a better understanding of the dangers of antibiotic resistance. The Federal Drug Administration is also ordered to 16 implement the new labeling process immediately. 17

- **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect immediately. 18

A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Clarify the Fourth Amendment

1	WHEREAS,	Privacy concerns in recent years have highlighted the ambiguity of the		
2		Fourth Amendment in the context of modern society; and		
3	WHEREAS,	The founding fathers never could have predicted the technological		
4		revolutions the United States has been through in the 20 th and 21 st		
5		centuries or the implications these would have on citizens within the		
6		framework o	of the constitution as-is; now, therefore, be it	
7	RESOLVED,	By two-third	s of the Congress here assembled, that the following article	
8		is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States,		
9		which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution		
10		when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states		
11		within seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:		
12		ARTICLE		
13		SECTION 1 : The Fourth Article of Amendment to the Constitution is		
14		hereby repealed, and replaced with the text in Section 2.		
15		SECTION 2 : The right of the people to be secure in their persons,		
16			houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches	
17		and seizures, shall not be violated, and the people's right to		
18		privacy in their data and communications shall not be		
19		abridged. No warrants shall be issued, but upon probable		
20			cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly	
21			describing the place to be searched, and the persons or	
22			things to be seized.	
23		SECTION 3 : The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by		
24			appropriate legislation.

A Resolution to Encourage Increased Kurdish Independence from the Central Iraqi Government

1	WHEREAS,	The Kurdish regional government wants increased independence from
2		Baghdad; and
3	WHEREAS,	The Kurds have been our biggest allies in Iraq since 2003; and
4	WHEREAS,	They will inevitably push for statehood with or without the United States;
5		and
6	WHEREAS,	the United States needs the Kurdish army to help fight the Islamic State;
7		and
8	WHEREAS,	this country has already supplied the Kurds with large amounts of
9		weaponry and ammunition that we need to ensure we remain in control
10		of; and
11	WHEREAS,	an independent Kurdish state could be a very useful ally in the region;
12		and
13	WHEREAS,	the Kurdish government has worked well with American interests in the
14		past; and
15	WHEREAS,	the Kurdish regional government is a fully functioning and democratically
16		elected body; now, therefore, be it
17	RESOLVED,	That the Congress here assembled support increased autonomy for the
18		Iraqi Kurds; and, be it
19	FURTHER RES	OLVED, That the United States will no longer ask foreign allies to stop
20		purchasing Kurdish oil.

A Bill to Establish a Federal Internet Sales Tax

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:			
2	SECTION 1.	The United States Federal Government shall collect a tax of 4% on all		
3		Internet transactions.		
4	SECTION 2.	Internet transactions shall be classified as the purchase of any good or		
5		service made over the Internet between a buyer and/or seller in the		
6		United States.		
7	SECTION 3.	The Internal Revenue Service, in tandem with the Federal Trade		
8		Commission, will oversee the implementation and collection of this tax		
9		Funds collected from this tax will be appropriated as follows: 50% of		
10		revenue of each transaction will be retained by the Federal Governmen		
11		25% to the state where the buyer resides, and 25% to the state where		
12		the seller resides. If the buyer and/or seller is a foreign entity, funds wil		
13		be retained by the Federal Government.		

- 14 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect on January 1^{st} , 2016.
- SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Tear Down This Wall With the EU

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 **SECTION 1**. The United States Federal Government shall actively pursue a reduction
- in trade barriers between the United States and the European Union.
- 4 **SECTION 2**. Trade barrier reduction would constitute slashing trade tariffs from the
- 5 current level of 3% to 1.5%.
- 6 **SECTION 3.** The United States shall lift all quotas on European goods, and shall urge
- 7 the European Union to reciprocate such action.
- 8 **SECTION 4.** The United States shall enter into further talks to establish a full free-
- trade zone between the United States and the European Union.
- SECTION 5. The Department of Commerce's International Trade Administration, the
- Department of State, and the U.S. International Trade Commission will be
- responsible for enacting the above provisions of this legislation.
- SECTION 6. The provisions of this legislation shall go into effect on January 1st, 2016.
- **SECTION 7.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

1	WHEREAS,	In recent months a wave of domestic violence, sexual assault, drug use,		
2		alcohol abuse, and general misbehavior has overwhelmed America's		
3		professional sports; and		
4	WHEREAS,	Professional athletes are a primary set of role models for American		
5		youth; and		
6	WHEREAS,	Teaching America's children that it is acceptable engage in morally		
7		reprehensible behavior with relatively little punishment, now, therefore,		
8		be it		
9	RESOLVED,	That the Congress here assembled demand that American professional		
10		sports leagues to impose draconian punishments for reprehensible		
11		behavior on behalf of their athletes; and, be it		
12	FURTHER RESOLVED, That local law enforcement be required to thoroughly investigate			
13	and, if deemed fit under the law, try all professional athletes who break			
14		the aforementioned laws.

A Resolution to Host an East Asian Peace Summit

1	WHEREAS,	There are currently many conflicting claims to territories in the South	
2		China Sea; and	
3	WHEREAS,	These territorial disputes have led to physical confrontation at sea, in	
4		addition to diplomatic tension; and	
5	WHEREAS,	This inability for East Asian nations to reach settlements is hindering the	
6		ability of these nations to tackle more pressing issues, as was shown by	
7		the lack of progress made during the ASEAN summit in August; now,	
8		therefore, be it	
9	RESOLVED, That the Congress here assembled host what will be referred to as the		
10		"ASEAN Peace Conference." The United States shall act as a mediator	
11		between representatives of each nation that wishes to lay a claim to	
12		currently disputed territories; and, be it	
13	FURTHER RES	SOLVED, That nations that agree on a plan to end a particular territorial	
14		dispute shall receive an increase in military aid from the United States	
15		not to exceed 0.25% of the 2015 Department of Defense budget.

A Bill to Demilitarize Local and State Law Enforcement

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:			
2	SECTION 1.	A. The Pentagon's 1033 Program shall hereby cease.		
3		B . A buyback program shall hereby be instituted, in which local and stat		
4		law enforcement agencies will be able to sell any military equipment		
5		received via the 1033 program back to the Department of Defense at		
6		120% of the market rate for arms and 150% for vehicles.		
7	SECTION 2.	The "1033 Program" shall be defined as the amendment to section 1033		
8		of the 1996 military spending bill, which permits the Department of		
9		Defense to transfer surplus military equipment to state and local law		
10		enforcement agencies.		
11	SECTION 3.	The Department of Defense shall receive an additional \$50 billion in		
12		funding specifically for the purpose of buying back military equipment		
13		from state and local law enforcement agencies. The Secretary of the		
14		Department of Defense shall also be responsible for reporting semi-		
15		annually to Congress on the quantity and type of weaponry being		
16		purchased from these agencies.		
17	SECTION 4.	This law shall take effect on January 1 st , 2015.		
18	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill To Protect Our College Students

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2	SECTION 1.	A. States will require each community college district, trustees and		
3		regents for public universities, governing boards for postsecondary		
4		institutions, and all other institutions providing a college level education		
5		to adopt an affirmative consent policy regarding sexual abuse.		
6		B . States that fail to enact or adequately enforce such policies shall cease		
7		to receive federal funding allocated for higher education.		
8	SECTION 2.	"Affirmative consent" shall be defined as two or more consenting		
9		partners who verbally agree to engage in consensual sexual activity while		
10		not under the influence of intoxicants, legal or otherwise. Sexual conduct		
that takes place outside of these paramete		that takes place outside of these parameters shall be subject to		
disciplinary measures by institutions of high		disciplinary measures by institutions of higher learning.		
"Higher Education" refers to any institution tha		"Higher Education" refers to any institution that provides educational		
14		services to students who posses a high school diploma or its equivalent.		
15	SECTION 3.	The Department of Education and the Department of Justice shall jointly		
16		be responsible for the enforcement of this legislation.		
17	SECTION 4.	This law shall take effect on January 1 st , 2015.		
18	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Allow All To Donate Blood

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:			
2	SECTION 1.	The Federal Drug Administration (FDA) will allow blood donations from all		
3		willing donors regardless of sexual orientation.		
4	SECTION 2.	The FDA stance on men who have sex with men (MSM), a lifetime ban		
5		from donating blood, should be updated to match current scientific and		
6		international standards of safety. Blood collected will be screened for		
7		pathogens and illnesses before being used.		
8	SECTION 3.	The Federal Drug Administration will be in charge of implementing this		
9		change and ensuring that blood drives are now easily accessible for all		
10		willing donors.		
11		A. The FDA will work in conjunction with the Red Cross, American		
12		Association of Blood Banks, and America's Blood Centers to ensure		
13		the change in deferment policy is made clear at blood banks.		
14		B. It will also ensure that proper safety techniques are being followed		
15		and that there are prepared tests to ensure every blood sample is		
16		completely clean of infection.		
17	SECTION 4.	This law will go into effect immediately after passage.		
18	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
