

A Resolution to Defend Our Cyber Infrastructure

- 1 **WHEREAS,** Electronic communication networks play an integral role in daily life for
2 everyone, regardless of national origin; and
- 3 **WHEREAS,** An attack on our communication network could have devastating
4 implications for both the US and the global economy; and
- 5 **WHEREAS,** The United States cannot afford to look vulnerable or complacent in light
6 of new and emerging threats; and
- 7 **WHEREAS,** The damage caused by an attack on our cyber networks is tantamount to
8 an act of war by a foreign power; now, therefore, be it
- 9 **RESOLVED,** That the Congress here assembled treat cyber attacks committed by
10 foreign governments as an act of war.

A Bill to Change the Voting Weights of the International Monetary Fund

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:


2 **SECTION 1.** The International Monetary Fund, or IMF, will now base the voting
3 weight given to each nation rather based on that nation's individual
4 contribution to the Fund as well as their overall importance to the
5 international economy.

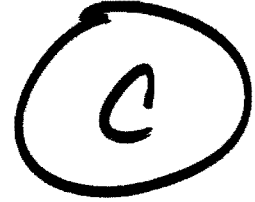
6 **SECTION 2.** Importance to the international economy will be based on that nation's
7 share of the world gross domestic product, along with the importance of
8 that nation's economy to the international economic order. The shift in
9 voting weights will also push the fund's main executive board away from
10 relying solely on the West to also incorporating major Eastern economies.

11 **SECTION 3.** The Department of the Treasury, alongside the U.S. Governor to the IMF,
12 will be in charge of implementing this procedural change to the Fund and
13 working with the IMF's Executive Board to establish the proper voting
14 percentages for each member nation.

15 **SECTION 4.** This law will go into effect immediately after passage.

16 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.





A Bill to Ban Pre-Employment Marijuana Drug Tests

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Employers will no longer be allowed to drug test potential employees for
3 marijuana before an official job offer has been accepted and the
4 employee has completed their first day of work.

5 **SECTION 2.** Post-employment drug tests are allowed, as all employees must still
6 adhere to the workplace policies established by their employer.

7 Employers may not fire or otherwise penalize employees found to be
8 using marijuana if the employee has a prescription and is following the
9 treatment plan prescribed by their doctor.

10 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Labor will be in charge of implementing this change
11 and monitoring both private and federal employers' transition to drug
12 testing that doesn't include THC tests.

13 A. The DOL will also work with certified laboratories to change their
14 unrinanalysis package to remove marijuana testing.

15 **SECTION 4.** This law will go into effect 6 months after passage.

16 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Designate a Teacher as a School Protection Officer

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** School districts will have the option of naming one or more teachers or
3 administrators, in either elementary or secondary schools, as a School
4 Protection Officer.

5 **SECTION 2.** A School Protection Officer must be authorized and licensed to carry a
6 concealed firearm inside schools within that district. The Officer will have
7 the ability to detain any suspicious person that they have reasonable
8 grounds to believe has violated school policy or state and federal law.
9 Any detained person that has violated a policy or law must be turned
10 over to a law enforcement agent as soon as possible.


11 **SECTION 3.** The U.S. Department of Education and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco,
12 Firearms, and Explosives will be in charge of implementing this
13 legislation.

14 A. The Department of Education and the ATF will work with school
15 districts to ensure that each Protection Officer has received the
16 proper training and followed all procedure for obtaining a concealed
17 carry license.

18 **SECTION 4.** This law will go into effect immediately after passage.

19 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to make the Proliferation Security Initiative a Legally Binding Agreement

- 1 **WHEREAS,** The Proliferation Security Initiative is currently a non-binding
2 international effort to prevent the spread of Weapons of Mass
3 Destruction and their materials; and
- 4 **WHEREAS,** all nations that have signed onto the PSI have done so voluntarily and can
5 leave the initiative at any time; and
- 6 **WHEREAS,** many nations that have signed onto this Initiative have not taken action
7 to achieve its goals; and
- 8 **WHEREAS,** the commitment of certain countries to follow international maritime law
9 alongside the PSI has not been fully established; and
- 10 **WHEREAS,** there is currently no consequence for a PSI member nation that fails in its
11 duties to monitor its ports and ships; and
- 12 **WHEREAS,** though the Initiative has been deemed a success in several instances, it
13 can still do more to properly protect materials that could be used to
14 create a Weapon of Mass Destruction; and
- 15 **WHEREAS,** a formal binding agreement will reassure member nations that other PSI
16 members should be trusted with an increased access to information; and
- 17 **WHEREAS,** a binding agreement could also be useful in convincing major nations
18 who haven't joined the initiative to sign onto the PSI; and
- 19 **WHEREAS,** the threat of WMDs or their parts getting into the hands of a rogue state
20 will only increase in 2015, therefore, be it
- 21 **RESOLVED,** That the Congress here assembled support an end to the EU membership
22 enlargement talks.

A Bill to Extend NAFTA


1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Congress shall hereby be directed to draft a proposal for a "Free Trade
3 Area of the Americas" to be discussed at summit in Miami, Florida with
4 representatives from all relevant nations.

5 **SECTION 2.** The "Free Trade Area of the Americas" shall be defined as a free trade
6 agreement between the nations of North, Central, and South America.

7 **SECTION 3.** The Office of the United States Trade Representative (OUSTR) shall
8 oversee the implementation of this bill.

9 **SECTION 4.** The proposed draft must be submitted to the OUSTR by January 1st, 2015,
10 and the summit in Miami must be held no later than January 1st, 2016.

11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.


A Bill to Bring In Some Blood

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 **SECTION 1.** Congress shall direct the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to end its
3 blood donation deferment policy for men who have had sex with other
4 men (MSM).
- 5 **SECTION 2.** Current regulations denying the ability of a potential donor to contribute
6 blood based on their gender or sexual orientation will be considered
7 illegal. Non-profit organizations that participate in gathering blood
8 donations will be denied federal funding and/or tax benefits bestowed by
9 Congress if they engage in discriminatory donor practices.
- 10 **SECTION 3.** The FDA shall oversee the implementation of this policy.
- 11 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect on June 30, 2015.
- 12 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Increase Fuel Taxes

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** A. Federal fuel taxes shall hereby be increased. The excise tax on gasoline
3 shall be increased to 28.4 cents per gallon and the excise tax on diesel
4 fuel shall be increased to 34.4 cents per gallon.

5 B. Federal fuel taxes will hereby be indexed to inflation, with rate
6 increases and decreases going into effect every 6 months.

7 **SECTION 2.** The Internal Revenue Service shall be in charge of enforcing this new law.

8 **SECTION 3.** This tax increase shall take effect on June 1st, 2015.

9 **SECTION 4.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to fund Body-Worn Cameras for Police

- 1 **WHEREAS,** Police are too often accused of using excessive force when apprehending
2 suspected criminals and video evidence is not available in the vast
3 majority of cases; and
- 4 **WHEREAS,** This has led to outrage among the American people and given police the
5 opportunity to use excessive force when it may not be necessary; and
- 6 **WHEREAS,** Unnecessary injuries and deaths have resulted and this is a travesty that
7 undermines the American justice system; now, therefore, be it
- 8 **RESOLVED,** That the Congress here assembled grant local police departments funding
9 for body-worn cameras.

A Resolution to Reduce Military Presence in East Asia

- 1 **WHEREAS,** The American pivot to Asia has been underwhelming as a result of commitments
2 elsewhere; and
- 3 **WHEREAS,** This pivot has only served to distract and take resources away from more
4 pressing disturbances such as those in the Middle East and domestically; and
- 5 **WHEREAS,** Our existing presence of Asia is satisfactory and includes great diplomatic
6 relationships with the key players in the region; and
- 7 **WHEREAS,** Less American influence can actually increase support for the US among people
8 in the region; now, therefore, be it
- 9 **RESOLVED,** That the Congress here assembled begin to move forward with policies that seek
10 to shift resources away from military presence in Asia and toward more pressing
11 issues facing the United States today.
